Catholic Charities of Delaware, Otsego and Schoharie Counties has launched a new program for men.

The Domestic Violence Program for Men is a Batterer Intervention Program fashioned after the New York Model. Men are referred to the program by courts, probation, CPS, and DA office. Referred men attend 26 or 52 sessions, one per week. This program is an accountability model, with policies and procedures that ensure compliance.

Domestic Violence is not a mental health or substance abuse issue, although these issues may coexist with abuse.
